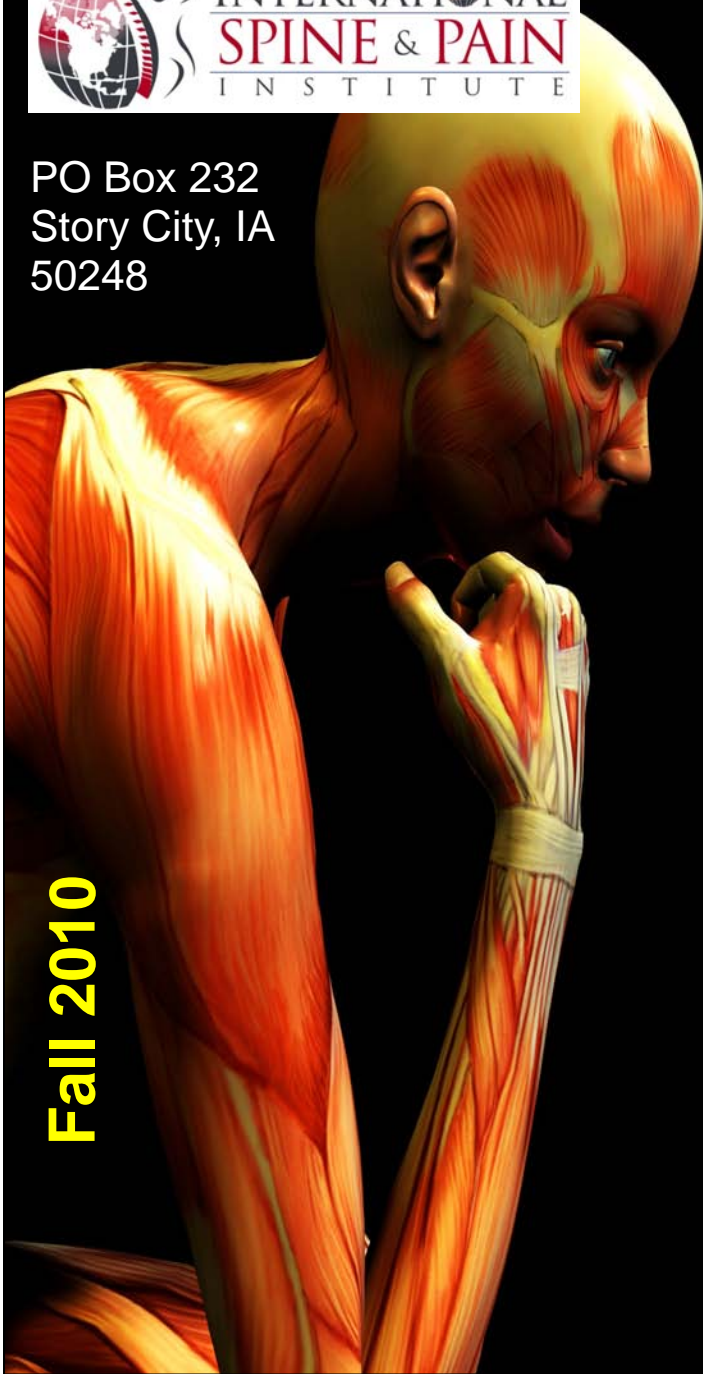

Pain, Brain, Illusions & Delusions

- Dr. Lorimer Moseley, PT, PT (Hons)., PhD (Sydney, Australia)

This 3 hour seminar focuses on the rapid expansion in our understanding of the role of the brain in pain, from acute pain to chronic and complex pain conditions. The seminar condenses a wealth of brain imaging and behavioral findings from clinical and basic science research to answer these questions: Is pain an emotion or a feeling, or neither, or both? Why does it hurt there? Why does it still hurt? How does the brain modulate pain? How does the brain become part of the problem? How does this relate to the real world? What can be done about it? Lorimer is convinced that the science, from animal and basic human studies to randomized clinical trials can be really interesting, but more so, directly relevant to clinical practice. That's why he thinks it should be in the hands of the clinicians, not just in the journals of the scientists. This seminar will be of great use to anyone who treats patients in pain.

Lumbar Surgery & Rehabilitation

This 3 hour presentation is designed to update attendees on the latest developments in surgical interventions for the lumbar spine as well as subsequent rehabilitation. The first session will discuss the indications for lumbar surgery followed by a description of surgical techniques commonly performed in the lumbar spine including laminectomy, discectomy, fusion and spine arthroplasty. In the second session clinicians will be introduced to the latest research into postoperative rehabilitation for the lumbar spine. Clinicians will become aware of the available evidence of postoperative rehabilitation as well as the limitations. A significant part of this section will describe the development and implementation of postoperative rehabilitation programs for patients undergoing common lumbar surgery procedures.
